

Specialty Drug Cost Sharing By State

The majority of insurance plans being sold on the health marketplaces require consumers to pick up a large share of the cost of specialty drugs. This chart shows the percent of plans in each state that require consumers to pay for 30 percent or more of the cost of those drugs.
